

CSS Assignment #3

Assigning CSS Classes

In this exercise, you will be creating separate CSS classes, which will be used to format different types of text. For the exercise, you will need to use two different websites. Follow the instructions below to complete the project.

1. Read the article, [“So, You Want CSS Classes and IDs, Huh?”](#).
2. Once you have read the article, create a new embedded style sheet.
3. In the style sheet, create three new classes, formatted with the definitions shown here:
 - a. `.coursetitle` – Make this text bold, italicized, 14 px font, Verdana, with a color of #006600
 - b. `.coursenumber` – Make this text bold, 12 px font, Verdana, with a color of #003399
 - c. `.description` – Make this text a 12 px font, Verdana.
4. Using the website www.kytechcurriculum.org/functions.asp, find the descriptions for the following courses, then paste them in a new Web page. Include the Course name, Course number, and Course Description. Lay out the information similar to the example in the box below.
 - a. IT 130
 - b. IT 132
 - c. IT 134
 - d. IT 230
 - e. CIS 130

Website Design

IT 130

This course focuses on the overall Web site production process involving layout, navigation, and interactivity, with particular emphasis on design. It will expose the student to the operation of digital video camera, scanners, and sound equipment. The design, layout, and composition of images, animation, and video suitable for Web site production is stressed.

5. Once you have pasted the information for all five courses, apply the CSS classes to each section. Apply the **.coursetitle** CSS class to the name (Website Design, in the example above). Apply the **.coursenumber** CSS class to the course number (IT 130, for example). Apply the **.description** CSS class to the description.
